

2007 Stuhr Scholarships Available Nov. 15

Applications for the 2007 Stuhr Scholarship Fund for Military Sons and Daughters will be available from Nov. 15, 2006 through Jan. 15, 2007.

The Stuhr Scholarships are awarded to high school seniors of active duty, reserve, guard or career retired military members. Dependents of both enlisted personnel and officers of the five service branches are eligible. Each of the six scholarships is valued at \$4,800 divided equally over four years.

The requirements for joining include:

- 4 Must be a high school senior
- 4 Must have a junior year and first half of senior year ranking in the top 10 percent of his/her class.
- 4 Must have a minimum SAT/ACT score of 1250/27
- 4 Must have evidence of extracurricular activities, and demonstrated leadership potential.
- 4 Must be a dependent of an active duty, reserve, guard or career military member.
- 4 Must be planning to attend a four-year accredited college or university (not a community college or military academy).
